### INTERVIEW WITH FIGU

CORE-GROUP MEMBER - MICHAEL VOIGTLÄNDER



#### 1. PLEASE INTRODUCE YOURSELF.

My name is Michael Voigtländer, I am 49 years old and was born in Walsrode, Germany. I grew up in a village called Schwarmstedt about 40 kilometers north of Hannover. I graduated from high school "Gymnasium Walsrode" and worked for many years as a camera assistant in the film industry in Germany. In the spring of 2018 I came to Hinterschmidrüti and since that time I live here.

## 2. WHEN & HOW DID YOU LEARN ABOUT BILLY/FIGU/GEISTESLEHRE

AND COULD YOU GIVE US AN ACCOUNT OF YOUR PATH TO BECOMING A FIGU CORE GROUP MEMBER?



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I discovered the photos of Billy on the internet in 2005/2006 when I wrote a screenplay which was partially about UFOs. The clarity of the photos struck me immediately and I was bewildered why Billy Meier was not wider known. I visited the center in 2007 and 2008 for about one hour each.

The people I talked to did not impress me very much and I was a Tibetan Buddhist/Dzogchenpa at the time and very involved in my religion. In 2017 the Süddeutsche Zeitung (major German newspaper) published the allegations of abuse by Sogyal Rinpoche by eight of his students. This triggered serious doubt in me about Tibetan Buddhism. If such a high teacher behaves so improperly there must be something wrong with the entire system of Tibetan Buddhism. There seemed to be a systemic error in the Dzogchen teachings and Tibetan Buddhism. The seed of true doubt was sown and I returned to reading the Semjase Blocks again. So I visited the SSSC on Sylvester 2017 (New Years Eve in the German speaking world) and my talk with Karin Wallèn was very good and we talked for several hours. In the following months my Buddhist believe system increasingly deteriorated and I decided that I want to know what the Geisteslehre is really all about. So I went to Switzerland in April 2018 and worked a lot with Billy during the summer clearing the shrubs and trees of old branches. The plant life had grown pretty wild in Hinterschmdirüti. That gave me the chance to ask Billy questions and I could discover that the Geisteslehre goes deeper than any religion or philosophy. In fact the Geisteslehre is endless. There is no end in learning and there is no point where it ends. E.g. in Buddhism the journey ends when you are enlightened though nobody knows what that means exactly. In Christianity God is the limit of all things. He is beyond everybody and everything and nobody is allowed to question his existence (if you look at the state of the world it must be a guy). So every religion has its limit and dogmas which limit your freedom and severely obstruct your evolutionary process. Obey and do NOT think for yourself is the mantra of all religions and the global society reflects that kind of behavior, too.

Billy also demonstrated one of his spiritual powers to me once without me asking for a demonstration of any kind. That was more impressive than seeing a UFO or may be meeting a Plejaren. But I do not want to talk about that experience. What I can say is that it is my experience that the Geisteslehre is completely inherently logical and makes totally sense. Billy told me on several occasions in 2018 that I shall not believe anything he says but that I have to investigate everything myself! That is still the way I keep it. Just when I am not sure about something I tend to adopt what Billy says. But that bases on direct experience with previous advice or recommendations of Billy which always turned out to be entirely right or at least very helpful. So I developed a trust base just like everybody does with a life partner or a very good friend. However I know that my thinking processes are more independent and clearer than it has ever been.

Generally it is my experience that my thinking in better and clearer in Hinterschmidrüti. I certainly have more ideas here than anywhere else. May be it has something to do with the telemeter disc above the center, but I am not sure about that.

Becoming a core group member was a logical progression and developed out of my constant presence in Hinterschmidrüti. Since I lived in Hinterschmidrüti it was not a must but basically expected to become a core group member. If you enjoy the benefits of living with the prophet in the same house, one should take the responsibility to support the mission to the best of one's ability. Therefore I entered the core group in June 2019 which I have never regretted so far.

3. WHAT ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT THINGS THAT YOU HAVE GAINED

#### FROM THE GEISTESLEHRE?

The most important thing I have gained from the Geisteslehre is the importance of self-responsibility. I am responsible for my thoughts, feelings and actions. Nobody else. If I learn to control (not suppress) my thoughts, feelings and actions I made a big step in the right direction. Once I have come to that point and live with great awareness I should try to take responsibility for my immediate environment (family, friends, etc.). If one can take responsibility on a societal level that is fantastic but in general our global society is still far too degenerated that a single person can make much difference. However if one has the ability and opportunity to effect positive change within society it would be one's responsible to try at least.

Also of great importance is attitude. Without gratitude and a neutral-positive thinking one cannot attain wisdom. Like Semjase said, we earth humans tend to overemphasize negative events in our lives and quickly forget about the positive experiences. And she said that ego is mankind's greatest obstacle. I agree absolutely.

#### 4. IF YOU COULD GIVE SOME

#### ADVICE TO OTHER FIGU GROUPS, FROM YOUR

EXPERIENCE AS A CG MEMBER, WHAT WOULD THAT ADVICE BE?

My experience as a core group member is very short and limited so far. But I would always advise a group that they should share the same vision which in the case of the FIGU is the mission. That is what everybody should be very clear about and that any activity should be viewed from the perspective to advance the mission. And that should be done with a long term perspective.

E.g. it is better to have few but committed members with integrity in character than many thousands of members who are superficial, selfish and ego driven. Even in the smallest possible group, a relationship between two individuals, if there is no sensible cooperation the relationship is either doomed or will be unhappy.

#### 5. IF YOU COULD TRAVEL BACK IN TIME

TO TALK TO THE 18-21 YEAR OLD YOU, WHAT

WOULD YOU SAY/WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE YOURSELF?

My current advice to my younger self would be to "relax" and "do not take yourself too seriously".

#### 6. WHAT IS YOUR

#### FAVOURITE BOOK AND WHY?

I do not really have a favorite book, but if I had to name one it is "Siddhartha" by Hermann Hesse. It moved me the most due to the depth of Siddhartha's character and the wisdom in the book. Closely followed by "The Forty Rules of Love" by Elif Shafak. However the most IMPORTANT book (109 booklets) is the Geisteslehre by Billy Meier. What is great about becoming a core group member is that you receive all 109 booklets (over 6000 pages). It is the most important book to me because it is true, pure and unstained wisdom and gives you the possibility to evolve the quickest.

#### 7. WHAT MUSIC DO YOU

#### LIKE TO LISTEN TO?

When I listen to classical music I mainly listen to Johann Sebastian Bach. Otherwise I enjoy melodic techno like Teho the most. But I listen to pop and rock of the 1980s, 1990s, too. After 2000 the music has become very disharmonious which began in the 1980s as Billy has written about.

#### 9. WHAT DO YOU THINK THAT

LIFE WILL BE LIKE HERE ON EARTH IN 50 YEARS TIME?

What life will be like in 2070 on earth depends a lot on the fact if the Yellowstone caldera has exploded by that time or not. This event will devastate the United States to such a degree that the United States will cease to be a world power. The entire country will be covered by ash. The closer to Yellowstone the higher it will be. The rest of the northern hemisphere will probably be darkened for a couple of years and crops will fail. There will be widespread famines like it happened after the eruption of the Peruvian volcano Huaynaputina in 1600. It darkened the sky for years in Europe and Russia and caused crops to fail and Russia experienced its worst famine in history. This event even contributed to the fall of tsar Boris Godunov. Just that the caldera in Yellowstone is much bigger than Huaynaputina. It will be a VEI 8, not a VEI 6 like the Huaynaputina. If you want to get an idea of the size of the cruption watch the realistic BBC TV movie "Supervolcano" from 2005.

But even if Yellowstone is still fine in 2070, the negative effects of unrestrained overpopulation will most likely have caused a global collapse of the financial system with terrible global consequences. The world has no oil anymore since we ran out in about 2050. So we will have a dramatic energy crises. Economies were not able to adapt to the new situation in 20 years. The average global temperature will probably be between 1.5 and 3 degrees Celsius higher than now. The oxygen levels will be quite a bit lower than today since about half of the amazon rain forest is burnt to the ground and will not recover for centuries. When the poles and a lot of the ice of Greenland have melted into the oceans we will have very dramatic storms around the world. Significant portions of land at the coast of several countries will be lost to the sea. These very destructive storms will be followed by horrible droughts and lots of wild fires which have already started today as it happened in Australia.

The soils of the land will be totally depleted of minerals due to the extreme global demand which means that the global population is dramatically under mineralized and highly prone to diseases additionally compounded by the lack of oxygen in the blood because of the lower oxygen level worldwide. Corruption and injustice will be much worse and even more widespread than today on all levels of society. But generally the higher up you go the worse it gets. If Russia has not stopped the EU-dictatorship, Europe will be a socialist superstate where the individual has no chance at all of initiating effective and positive change. Empathy and compassion will be the exception in society. The norm will be that almost everybody will look out for one's own and selfish interests only.

Superficiality and stupidity will be unfathomable. It will be a time of great confusion and destruction though not by a nuclear war. During the second half of the 21st century many millions will die an unnatural death due to natural disasters, starvation and disease. Summing it up, it will be dreadful for most people to live on terra in 2070. Whatever the details will be, it is essential not to become depressed and to focus on the present and pursue the evolution of one's consciousness. Only the present can be changed and we should seize that opportunity every day.

CHALLENGES THAT US OUTSIDE THE CG ARE NOT AWARE OF?

One should be aware of the time commitment and having to be present in Hinterschmidrüti regularly if one considers to become a core group member. But if you like to support the mission it is not hard because it is meaningful work and you know that it will benefit many people several centuries in the future.

#### 11. IS THERE OR WAS THERE ONE THING

#### THAT MADE YOU DECIDE TO JOIN THE CG

INSTEAD OF JUST REMAINING A PASSIVE GROUP MEMBER?

I was asked by the president of the FIGU (not Billy), if I want to join the core group and as I described earlier it was a natural progression to join.

#### 12. REGARDING MEDITATION DOES THE

AMOUNT OF TIME THAT YOU CAN BE 'FREE OF

#### THOUGHT' INCREASE OVER TIME?

It should if you practice correctly and daily. However meditation is not a sport and one should not get fixated on the amount of time one can remain free of thought. I think that the ability to focus and relax at the same time is most important factor in meditation. Trying to cultivate concentration and relaxation simultaneously is not that easy as it might appear. All meditation is a waste of time anyway if character development is neglected or even ignored. But I am no expert on meditation. You have to make your own experiences.

13. WHAT, IF ANY, ARE YOUR DIFFERENT PERCEPTIONS

#### FROM MEDITATING IN YOUR OWN

ENVIRONMENT TO THAT OF THE SOHAR CENTRE?

The Sohar-Centre shields you to some degree from negative energies, but not all negative energies. So it provides you with a better environment to practice meditation. But one should not give the Sohar-Centre so much importance. There are athletes who have lousy conditions for practicing their sport and then they become Olympic champions. So attitude and especially commitment are more important.

#### 14. YOU INTEND/ARE PLANNING TO MAKE

A FILM ABOUT BILLY, FIGU, GL ETC. CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THAT PLEASE? (THE IDEA, FORMAT, DIFFICULTIES, HOPES ETC.)

It shall be a feature documentary and mostly in 4K. The first half of the documentary shall be more about the evidence, photos, audio recording, metal sample, witnesses and so on. The second half shall be more about the Geisteslehre, overpopulation and the enslavement of the consciousness of mankind by religion. You see, it will be a real blockbuster. Just joking. My hope is to get it into a few film festivals and may be find a distributor that it will run in a few cinemas somewhere throughout the world. The main obstacle is the financing as it is with most documentaries.

#### HOW HAS THAT BEEN?

I disagree. How much you learn about the Geisteslehre depends on your attitude. Every group whether it is a study group or core group has members who are more committed and also those who are less committed and are unwilling to learn and be self-reflecting. Billy wrote a tiny booklet "Meditation und das Leben selbst sind deine besten Lehrer" ("Meditation and life itself are your best teachers").

So everybody can evolve greatly just by being aware of these two things and to learn by trial and error throughout life. However our life span is very short and travelling the path of trial and error only takes a very long time. Therefore it is smarter and much quicker to read about reality in the Geisteslehre and think about it and discover the truthfulness in life and nature and to take advantage of this precious opportunity to evolve quicker. One's own effort is the decisive factor though. The Geisteslehre prohibits (in the sense of advising against)

any force to study and learn. The initiative must always come from oneself.

There are two types of heather on the heathland, Bell heather (Erica cinerea) and Ling heather (Calluna), the SSB's preferring the Bell heather, but the heathland also attracts ground nesting birds Nightjars (Caprimulgus) which migrate to the heath in the summer from Africa, the Dartford Warbler (Sylvia undata) and the Woodlark (Lullula arborea), all of which rely on the insects that live on heaths.



Before humans started to interfere with natural landscapes, the heathland had grazing animals which kept at bay new tree saplings and kept the heath in pristine condition for the rest of natures inhabitants and visitors.

However, due to our interference, conservation work parties are required to mainly remove Birch and Conifer saplings and keep at bay bracken all of which are constantly trying to take over the heathland.

Other than the size and amount of land, there is no difference between our thought experiment of the 1 mile x 1 mile piece of land above and our planet Earth.
